Fares for all trains are available on the Ventra smartphone app. where riders can purchase one-way. 10-ride and monthly tickets or Round Trip Plus and \$10 Weekend Passes using a debit/credit card or stored transit value on a linked Ventra account. All tickets (except Round Trip Plus) are also available at ticket agents at downtown terminals and select suburban stations. At stations where a station agent is not on-duty, passengers can purchase cash one-way tickets from conductors. Round Trip Plus tickets are valid on all Metra train lines within the zone pair purchased on the day activated: \$10 Weekend Passes are valid on all Metra train lines in all fare zones for the entire weekend. Monthly tickets include full Weekend Passes.

Metra operates on a fare zone structure, with distance-based fares. Currently, there are ten fare zones system-wide, lettered Zone A to Zone J. Metra fares can be used interchangably between Metra lines provided trips do not go beyond the listed zone pair on the ticket. For trips that do go beyond the listed zone pair, riders may wish to purchase an incremental ticket for the difference rather than purchasing a full-price one-way ticket. Transfers between Metra and the CTA or Pace are not included in ticket prices; a full fare is required to change to those buses and trains.

For frequent riders. Metra offers bulk discounts in the form of 10-ride tickets and monthly passes. A 10-ride ticket represents a 5% discount compared to ten one-way tickets; a monthly pass provides a discount for riders using Metra 30 times or more in a calendar month. Monthly passes also include Weekend Passes for that month. Discounted fares are also available for seniors, K-12 students (with a student I.D.), riders with disabilities, military personnel, and more: visit metrarail.com for more information.

Passengers purchasing tickets from conductors when a ticket agent or ticket vending machine is available must pay an additional \$5 fee. There is no penalty to buy a ticket onboard trains using the Ventra smartphone app.

Service Information

Metra operates 11 lines serving 242 stations throughout the Chicago region. Service is most frequent during weekday rush periods, with only occasional service during weekday midday periods and minimal service on nights and weekends. On holidays, Metra operates weekend schedules.

This table shows 14 service patterns operated by Metra. Generally, "late night" service refers to service after 11:00pm; last trains leave downtown between 10:30pm and 1:00am, depending on the line. Overnight service is not offered. Check schedules for more information.



Transfers and Connections

For transfers between Metra lines, inform a conductor when your ticket is checked. Metra-to-Metra transfers are included in Round Trip Plus. Day Passes, and Weekend Passes. Transfers between Metra and the CTA, Pace, or the South Shore Line require a second full fare: Ventra app users can use stored CTA/Pace transit value to purchase Metra tickets.

Accessibility

At least one coach on each Metra train is fully ADA-compliant. All downtown terminals, most suburban stations, and some city stations are wheelchair-accessible, although a few may not meet full ADA standards. On off-peak trains, cyclists are permitted to Bikes may not be accommodated on busy weekends.
